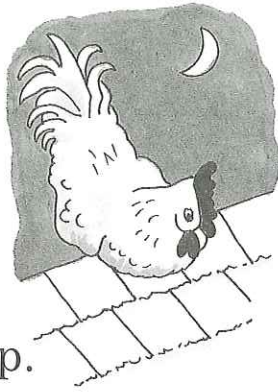

"What is it?" asked the rooster.

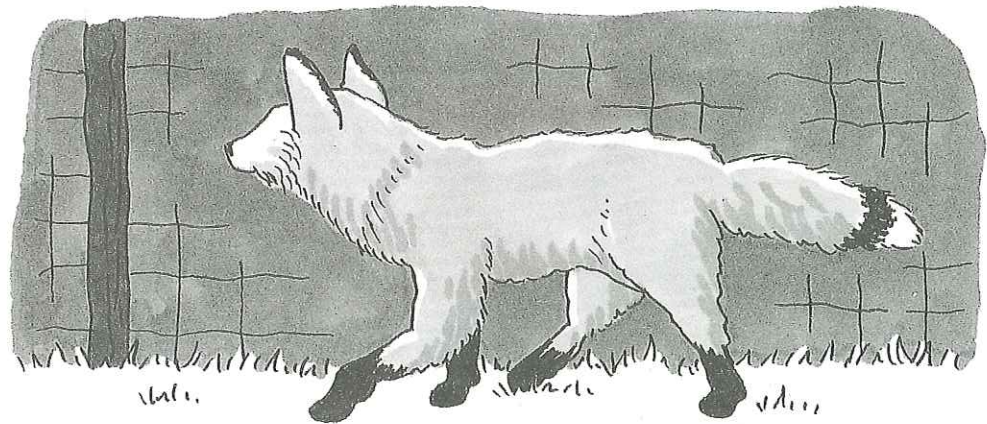
"King Lion has just made a new rule.

"I'll be careful," said Billy. "Now give me a boost."

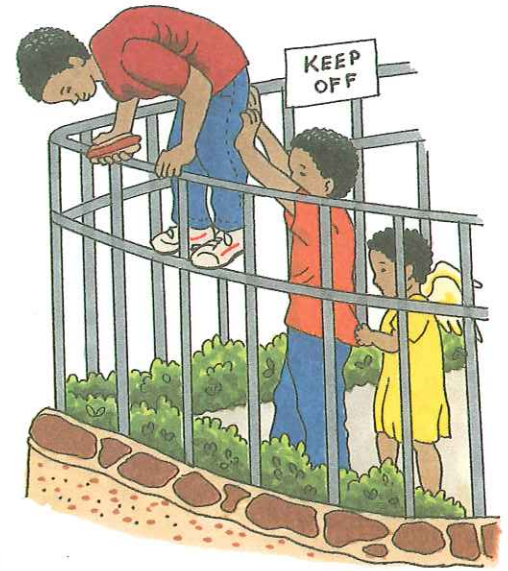
Sam boosted Billy to the top of the railing. "I can see a bear sitting in a pool!" cried Billy. He leaned over to get a better look.

SPLASH! Billy tumbled over the railing. He fell into the bear's pool. "Billy!" screamed Sam.

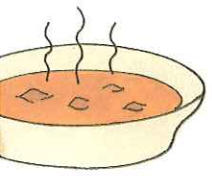
"Get the zookeeper!" yelled a man.

The bear grunted. Then it took a step towards Billy. "Help!" he cried.



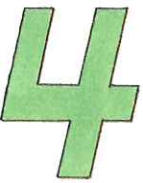

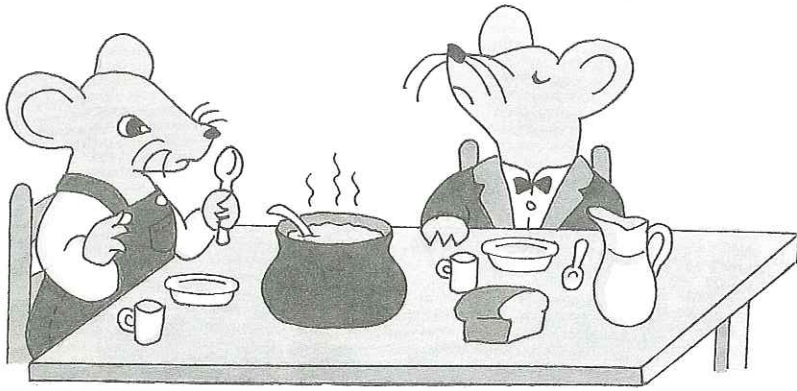
## The City Mouse and the Country Mouse

“I’m glad to see you!” cried the country mouse. “Have a seat. I’ll fix dinner.”

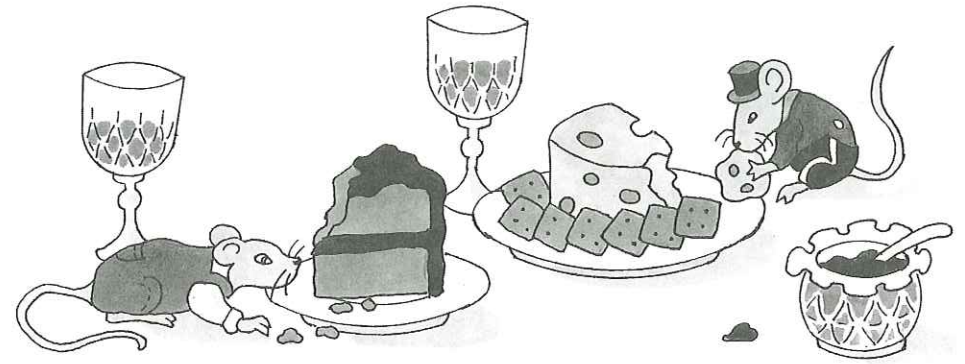
The city mouse looked around for a soft chair to sit on. But all he could find was a rough wooden chair.

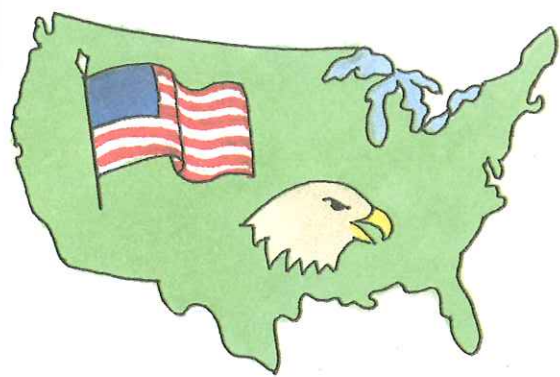
Suddenly a huge dog
