Spelling Course

Students are required to learn the spelling of all words in each lesson and definitions of <u>five</u> (5) words per week. You may choose three words to define, but be sure to include the two religious words at the end of each list as these <u>two (2) religious words</u> are included on the weekly tests. There are 20 words in each lesson. Make sure that their handwriting is neat and readable. If you wish, an oral trial test may be given midweek for the purpose of review and study for the Friday written test. The test should be on the spelling of <u>all</u> the words and the <u>definition</u> of the two <u>religious words</u>. Spelling test forms may be found in the Writing Handbook.

<u>GRADING</u>: Two (2) points will be given for each correct spelling word and five (5) points for each correct religious definition. If all spelling words and definitions are both correct, the perfect score is 50 points (20 words x 2 points = $\underline{40}$ and 2 definitions x 5 points = $\underline{10}$), a score of 50 points = $\underline{100}$ %. There is no need for a daily grade for spelling, just the scores for the final test on Friday and/or the trial test if $\underline{100}$ %. (Example: $\underline{-0/20}$ words; $\underline{-1/2}$ definitions = $\underline{45}$ pts. = $\underline{90}$ %). If you have any questions, please send a note with your lesson plans to the tutor.

Definitions for religious words are taken from the <u>Baltimore Catechism #2</u> (available from Our Lady of Victory School). The number in the parenthesis (#) at the end of the definition indicates the page number on which that word and definition may be found.

Handwriting Workbook

Objectives

- 1. This workbook has been designed to continue with spelling development, and cursive handwriting practice for the third year level.
- 2. Students will learn from repetitious practice the proper spelling of words and formation of cursive letters and punctuation. Both upper and lower case letters will be covered.
- 3. The workbook will also be used in conjunction with the handwriting component of our program, and will help to improve the student's penmanship while providing additional practice for each week's spelling lesson.
- 4. At the third grade level, <u>cursive hand-writing is now required</u> for students continuing their O.L.V.S. education. Lessons and tests will only be accepted for full credit in cursive handwriting. Special exceptions may be obtained from O.L.V.S to deviate from this standard.

Method

- A. Day one of each week's spelling lesson the student will study all words; and memorize definitions of 5 words of your choice. (Include the last 2 religious words of lesson in definitions to be memorized.)
- B. Day two, the student will do the <u>Cursive</u> <u>Handwriting Drills</u> in the TCS Workbook on the pages that correspond to that week's lesson plan.
- C. Day three, the student will repeat day one, and may take an <u>oral</u> Trial TEST: words and definitions in preparation for test on day five.
- D. Day four, the student will do the <u>Word Study</u> exercise pages in the TCS Workbook corresponding with that week's lesson plan, and study missed words from the Trial TEST.
- E. Day five, the student will prepare for and take the spelling test (20 words and the two religious definitions) that corresponds with that week's lesson plan.

General Handwriting Instructions


The handwriting pages have been designed as a tool to help the student to learn the proper spelling of each word by means of repetitious writing, as well as to reinforce proper writing techniques taught at this level in the "Writing Can Help" course.

Be sure the child sits properly, holds the pencil correctly, and slants the writing paper. The paper should be placed directly in front, slanted at the same angle as the writing arm. The arm should slide easily across the paper. The pencil should point toward the shoulder of the hand holding the pencil. The child should grasp the pencil between the thumb and index finger, letting it rest lightly on the middle finger. Tutor should demonstrate this often, as well as monitor the students performance throughout the course.

A left handed student should slant the paper in the opposite direction of a right handed student. The student should not be allowed to "hook" by bending the wrist with the hand above the writing line. The slant in either case should match the slant in this book and in the "Writing Can Help" handwriting book. ("Writing Can Help" is also available through Our Lady of Victory School.)
